Exhibition

- Curators: Martin Maischberger, Andreas Scholl, Moritz Taschner
- Exhibits: ca. 80 ancient artworks, including numerous panels from the Telephos Frieze, the Parrot Mosaic, the Beautiful Head of Pergamon, the Prometheus Group, the Archaistic Dancer, portraits of the rulers of Pergamon and architectural elements of the Pergamon Altar
- Exhibition conception and design: Yadegar Asisi with Mathias
 Thiel and Studio asisi, in collaboration with the Antikensammlung
 Staatliche Museen zu Berlin
- Thematic focuses: the Pergamon Altar, the Great and Small friezes, the city layout and the Pergamenian Kingdom, the rulers of Pergamon and their palaces, the Sanctuary of Athena, Gods in Pergamon, the Pergamon excavation, the history and future of the Pergamonmuseum
- 4 large-format installations by Yadegar Asisi with Studio asisi
- 7 Asisi originals (drawings/paintings of: the Altar terrace, 3 studies inspired by the head of Heracles, palace furnishings, reconstruction of the north frieze, reproduction of the panorama (4.4 m x 1.3 m)

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Information on the Panorama artwork

Artist: Yadegar AsisiCircumference: 104 m

Height: 30 m

- 35 strips of fabric sewn together
- Polyester printed with a dye-sublimation transfer
- More than 3,100 square metres of image surface, mounted in a cylindrical form

Panorama Contents

- Circular painting with a unique panoramic perspective of the acropolis of Pergamon (at an elevation of 300 metres), the lower city and the surrounding landscape
- Reconstruction of the ancient city based on the archaeological excavations carried out over the past 140 years
- Setting of scenes of festivities and everyday life in the Graeco-Roman metropolis Pergamon in the spring of 129 AD, artistically arranged and condensed
- View of the temples of Trajan, Dionysus and Athena, the theatre and the area surrounding the Pergamon Altar, and of the Roman lower city
- Light installation set to a soundscape simulating the shift from day to night

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- Compared with the first panorama of 2011/2012, additional aspects of everyday life and of the society of Pergamon have been incorporated into the scene
- Integration of numerous new scenes, produced with the involvement of 40 extras
- The focus of the depiction is on the festival in honour of the god Dionysos ("Dionysia")
- Reworking of architectural and topographic aspects based on recent research
